RESOLUTION REQUIRING BURNING PERMITS



WHEREAS, it appears to be to the advantage of the public health, safety and welfare to the residents of Fire District 34 that the Board of Fire Commissioners of said District within King County, Washington assume the privileges of issuing fire permits to any person, firm or corporation within the district who shall start or continue or cause to be started or continued any open fire in a cleared or cultivated land within the boundaries of the district, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 52.28 RCW, the District is granted the authority of assuming the privilege of issuing such permit by resolution upon notice as provided by statute, now, therefore,


IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners that on or after the 1st day of May, 1973, no person, firm or corporation shall start or continue or cause to be started or continued any open fire on any cleared or cultivated land within the area of the district without a written permit therefor issued by authority to the District and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the secretary of the District shall cause this resolution to be published once per week for three consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within King County, and within the fire district and that the notice be posted within three public places within the district.
