Resloution No. 75/73

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING PAYMENT OF COMPENSATION
TO VOLUNTEER'S FOR ATTENDANCE AT DRILLS AND RESPON-
DING TO FIRE ALARMS AND AID CALLS.

WHEREAS, the District has paid the Volunteer's for attending drills and answering alarms at the rate of \$4.00 per drill and \$4.00 per alarm, and

WHEREAS, the District has experienced some difficulty in budgeting funds in the past because of the unknown factor of the number of alarms in any one year, and

WHEREAS, the budget process of funding the Volunteer's pay would be simplified by adopting a system of credits for attendance at Drills and responding to Fire Alarms and Aid Calls; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of King County Fire Protection District No. 34 that a revised method of payment to Volunteer members of the department for attendance at Drills and responding to Fire Alarms and Aid Calls be adopted as follows:

1. That eight (8) credits be given for two (2) hours of Drill
2. That four (4) credits be given for any incident.
3. That one (1) credit be given for every fifteen (15) minutes after the first hour for Overtime.
4. That each Credit shall have a value not to exceed One (\$1.00) Dollar.
5. That the value of each credit shall be determined by the dividing the total sum of money budgeted for Volunteer pay by the total earned credits.
6. That the total earned credits shall be multiplied by the Credit value to determine the amount of each Volunteer's pay.

That this method of determining the Volunteer's pay is retroactive to January 1, 1973.

ADOPTED at a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of King County Fire Protection District No. 34 this 5th day of November, 1973.
