A RESOLUTION TO GIVE WRITTEN CONSENT TO THE DISPOSAL OR REPLACEMENT OF EQUIPMENT.

WHEREAS, Paragraph 6, of the contract between the Fire District and the City of Redmond, dated January 1, 1974, provides for a written consent of the Fire District when it becomes desirable to dispose or replace any of the property of the District, and


WHEREAS, under the terms of this contract, the Fire District had transferred to the City of Redmond, a 1967 Crown pumper, serial number F1491, and

WHEREAS, the 1967 Crown pumper has served its useful purpose and has been replaced by a later model and more efficient unit to serve the community, now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Commissioners of King County Fire Protection District No. 34 give their consent to the City of Redmond to dispose of the 1967 Crown pumper, serial number F1491, with the proceeds going into the Fire Apparatus Replacement Fund.

Our Department has entered into the position of having to replace our pumers on a regular basis.

Equipment purchased in 1967 are 20 years old, which is the life expectancy of a pumper.

Several weeks ago we took delivery of a new 1500 gpm pumper and now have a pumper for surplus.

Being that Apparatus 8004 (1967 Crown) was originally purchased by District #34, I am requesting the authorization to surplus this apparatus with the proceeds being placed into the Fire Department apparatus replacement fund.

Apparatus 8004 is in good condition, and because of that condition, I will be asking a minimum bid of \$26,000. In the event the minimum bid is not received, I will be requesting permission to negotiate with interested parties or re-advertise.

The City of Redmond Council will also be requested to authorize sale of the vehicle.

Attached is a resolution authorizing the sale of Apparatus 8004.

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
