

Ordinance/Resolution No. 124/87

WHEREAS, Section 4, Chapter 172, laws of 1982, Revised Code of Washington 70.136.030 as amended requires that the governing body of King County Fire Protection District No. 34 designate a hazardous materials incident command agency within the boundaries of the fire district; and

WHEREAS, the King County Fire Protection District No. 34 has considered the training, manpower, expertise, and equipment of available agencies and the applicable codes and regulations; and

WHEREAS, the King County Fire Protection District No. 34 finds that there is no agency but the Redmond FPD is available to meet the responsibility of an incident command agency;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the governing body of King County Fire Protection District No. 34 that the Redmond FPD is hereby designated as hazardous materials incident command agency to operate within the boundaries of King County Fire Protection District No. 34.
