- II. Recap of Last Discussions – Chariman Johnston reviewed previous discussions held at the Forum.
- III. Update of Current Efforts – Quadrant will break ground in April for Redmond Ridge Station 18 that should be completed by January 1, 2006. A dorm and a hose tower were added to the station design to make it more amenable to staffing. A meeting was held with the Redmond Ridge Homeowners Association where they participated in picking out station colors.
- IV. Next Steps/Future Discussions – This year the commissioners will be analyzing which station's personnel to relocate to Station 18. Council Member Paine asked if staffing only three stations in the district was due to cost or duplicate coverage. Chairman Johnston replied that the City of Sammamish took part of the district's coverage area when they incorporated, and Redmond Ridge is the biggest growth area. In addition, the current budget will not accommodate four stations.
